

# A Word From Pastor Tim

Who is SPLC? Why is SPLC here?

What are the most important skills for a pastor at SPLC?

These are sample questions from the Ministry Site Profile—the forms we will fill out to describe our congregation for pastors interested in serving here. In our case, the ministry site is SPLC. SPLC like all ministry sites (aka congregations) has its own character, perspectives and priorities. Pastors seeking to move to Pine Island need to know about these things.

So, we, as a congregation, do three things.

- 1. Seek God's will for the SPLC's future through prayer.
- 2. Seek wisdom about the SPLC's future from as many members as possible.
- 3. Commission a Transition Team to fill out the Ministry Site Profile.

If you have been around SPLC for many years you probably remember other pastor searches that did not include a Transition Team. The call committee filled out all the needed forms and then did the interviews. These days, call committees still do interviews and recommend a pastor to a congregation. However, councils ask a Transition Team to lead the process of collecting information from the congregation and filling out the Ministry Site profile.

Councils do this for two reasons:

- 1. It allows more people to be involved in the process.
- 2. It lessens the commitment of volunteers who serve on the call committee, which can last for several months.

Right now, we are in the process of seeking members of the Transition Team. Commonly the team is made up of five members. Writing and listening skills are helpful. The Time expectation is Mid-October through January.

Once the team is formed. They choose Five Sundays in a row (the Sundays of November?). We have a shortened worship service and then invite all those present to help the team figure out the answers to the questions on the Ministry Site Profile. They do this by asking all to stay after worship, fill out surveys and questionnaires, and discuss possibilities and concerns in small groups.

Your wisdom and faith are desperately needed in this process! Please plan now to attend worship in November and stay after to help the Transition Team do their work. There will be treats and plenty of coffee—and the Holy Spirit will be present to guide us in seeking the next pastor.
