

A Word From Your Pastor



The Lenten season starts with Ash Wednesday worship. March 5th this year, there is no other worship service in the church year like it. After we admit our need for repentance and for God's mercy, we receive the sacrament of Holy Communion, and our baptismal cross is traced in ash accompanied by the words: *Remember You Are Dust and To Dust* You Will Return. Marked with the cross of ash, we leave worship in silence; filled with sorrow and contemplating how we will live through the Lenten season.

One of the ways disciples of Jesus live through the Lenten season is by engaging in additional use of the four traditional Lenten disciplines of Study, Worship, Giving, and Service. The disciplines of *Study* and *Worship* can be fulfilled at mid-week worship. During the season of Lent, Sunday School and Confirmation Students are holding a "Penny War" to support the Pine Island Area Ministerial Fund. (the Ministerial Fund helps Pine Island area residents with food and gas emergencies) You can Give generously to this effort. The Pine Island community, Saint Paul Lutheran, and probably your place of work have opportunities to *Serve* the needy.

To assist the Saint Paul Lutheran worshiping community with the discipline of study this Lenten season, the message portion of mid-week Lenten worship will be reviewing the10 Commandments. There is an ancient Christian tradition where those planning to join a church use the Lenten Season to prepare by studying the bible and catechism. The process is called Catechumenate and those studying are known at the Catechumen. In Lent 2025 we will all be Catechumen. (schedule below)

Our midweek worship service, which should last about 45 minutes, will be guided by the service of Holden Evening Service of Prayer and music.

To help people make room in their busy lives for the discipline of Lenten worship, the congregation's youth will be serving meals 5:30-6:45. You may contribute to a freewill-offering with all proceeds going to youth ministries. (menu on this page)

May God's many Blessings be obvious as you live thru this Lenten Season being diligent in your use of the Lenten Disciplines of Worship, Study, Service and Giving.


