

There was no celebrating for the women when they found Jesus' empty tomb. They did not know their dear friend and teacher had conquered death for humanity and was alive. The hole in their lives where Jesus had been, just kept getting bigger and emptier. We all know what it feels like to have a big empty place in our life.

It happens ...

- · when you give your heart to someone who doesn't accept the gift
- · when you learn a sport, practice hard and still don't make the team
- · when you study and pursue a profession, only to find you hate your work
- · when you try to resist a temptation, but then give in to it again and again
- · when you move to a new job, then lose it in a downsizing
- when you lose a spouse to cancer, and find yourself all alone in the world. These are big empty cold holes. Massive voids. Not easily filled.

These women are suffering from a great loss. We know a bit about how they feel. They watched their dearest friend suffer a gruesome death and now as they arrive at his tomb to do the last thing they can for him, they find nothing, a big empty cold nothing. They are shocked and terrified to be standing in front of an empty tomb and still somehow, they able to hear and believe the strangers who tell them; Jesus is alive and waiting to meet them in Galilee.



A Word From Your Pastor

Believe in Jesus Resurrection. Follow Jesus into the future. These are responses, we like the women can make, responses that can fill the massive empty places in our lives. Emptiness will not be eliminated by a new career, a new spouse, a new house, a new car, or a better salary, but the empty holes in life can be filled by believing in the resurrection and following Jesus into the future. On Easter morning the women entered an empty tomb, grieving. On Easter morning WE enter a full church to celebrate the empty tomb, knowing the empty places in our lives can be filled because of an empty tomb.

Easter is the most important celebration in the Christian Church. Throughout history it has remained almost exclusively a Christian celebration, because there are few worldly distractions attached to it. The Easter Bunny gets little attention compared to Santa. There are no airline scheduling issues for travelers, because so few go home for the celebration. There are no outside lights, no office parties and no Easter carols.

Why do you suppose Christmas gets so much attention in and out of the church compared to Easter? Well, it is quite easy to take a baby and God choosing to live with us and turn the story into a beautiful, grand celebration. It's a whole different thing to pretty-up crucifixion and an empty tomb and one wants to admit to being a sinner in need of rescue. Christmas is sentimental, spectacular, stimulating, and so much more. It contains bits and pieces of all the things we WANT to have fill the holes in our lives. Easter is what we NEED. It's unconditional love and forgiveness that can fill all the empty places in our lives.


