

A Word From Your Pastor

Last Thanksgiving was the last time my mother was at my home for a meal. Many years before, after the meal had been cleared and the dishes washed Mother said, "I'm done. I'm too old to do this again. Thanksgiving is yours from now on." Thanksgiving meals are still much like when I grew up; too much

food combined with a variety of relatives and friends who find themselves far from home. Around the table last year, besides my parents and Mark and I were my sister and a brother, Mark's sister, Mom's sister, Dad's brother, our daughter, all their spouses, a cousin and a lot of food. I used Mom's recipe for stuffing, her china and crystal and Mark gathered chairs from around the house.

It is no surprise that Thanksgiving celebrations are centered around a meal. The holiday was created at a time when many American's lives were centered on producing food for their families. A gathering centered on a meal was an appropriate way to celebrate a bountiful or even adequate crop and that enough had been harvested to feed one's family until the next harvest. Today very few Americans are farmers, with most of our groceries come from the store and we continue to celebrate Thanksgiving with a meal. Having a meal with friends and loved ones is a wonderful way to celebrate special relationships whether we grew or even cooked the food. We also use this time of year, while saying thanks in a variety of ways, to remember the many people who are not able to eat daily.

This November the Sunday School Students are leading Saint Paul Lutheran in raising Food Insecurity Awareness through gathering food for the food insecure; a very important way to celebrate Thanksgiving and the many blessings God places in our lives. (Read more about this later in the Newsletter) Sunday November 24 is when Saint Paul Lutheran celebrates Thanksgiving in worship. As part of that service, we plan to bring all the food gathered during November to the alter as part of our offerings. You may bring your offering of food during the month or on November 24. (of course, cash and checks are also welcome) After worship, the food will be delivered to the food shelf for distribution; maybe even before Thanksgiving.

Confirmation students tell me, Thanksgiving is one of the times in the year when their families always pray before eating. They also tell me praying is hard, so I offer you a Thanksgiving prayer. Maybe you can pass it around the table with each person praying a line and of course you can add more lines.

Thanksgiving is a time for special meals and to make sure everyone gets to eat daily meals.
