A Word From Your Pastor



In 2024 we had one baptism at Saint Paul Lutheran. In 2025 there are three scheduled already. As disciples of Jesus, we love to celebrate and witness the sacrament of Baptism, because watching the parents and young children being touch by God changes us as well as the family. With the younger children, we look at each other just-in-case we get to see the cross put each of us in Baptism. It is that Baptismal Cross we now consider.

The Baptismal Cross is created at Baptism and trace of many times throughout, our life. Those not taking the sacrament of Holy Communion can have their Baptismal cross traced, at confirmation it is traced as we call the Holy Spirit into the life of the one being confirmed, and on Ash Wednesday everyone can have their cross traced in ashes, while hearing *remember you are dust and to dust you will return.* Ash Wednesday is our solemn entry into the 40 days of Lent.

Why write about Lent and Ashes when March fifth is a month away? Because we are trying something new this coming year and we want to give you and families with Sunday School students plenty of time to prepare. On March fifth as the people of God in this place, we will receive Holy Communion and ashes as one community of believersand separately we will hear Gospel proclaimed; the children will have Ash Wednesday School and the rest of us will have a sermon and scripture readings. (no Sunday School 32.25)

Come join God's people as we begin the journey through Lent that ends with the celebration of God's love made manifest on Easter Sunday.
